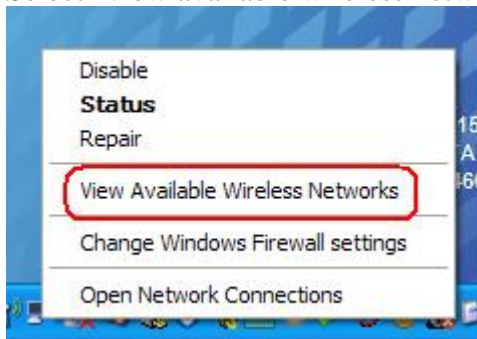


Connecting to the “Guest” wireless network at the Johnson County Courthouse

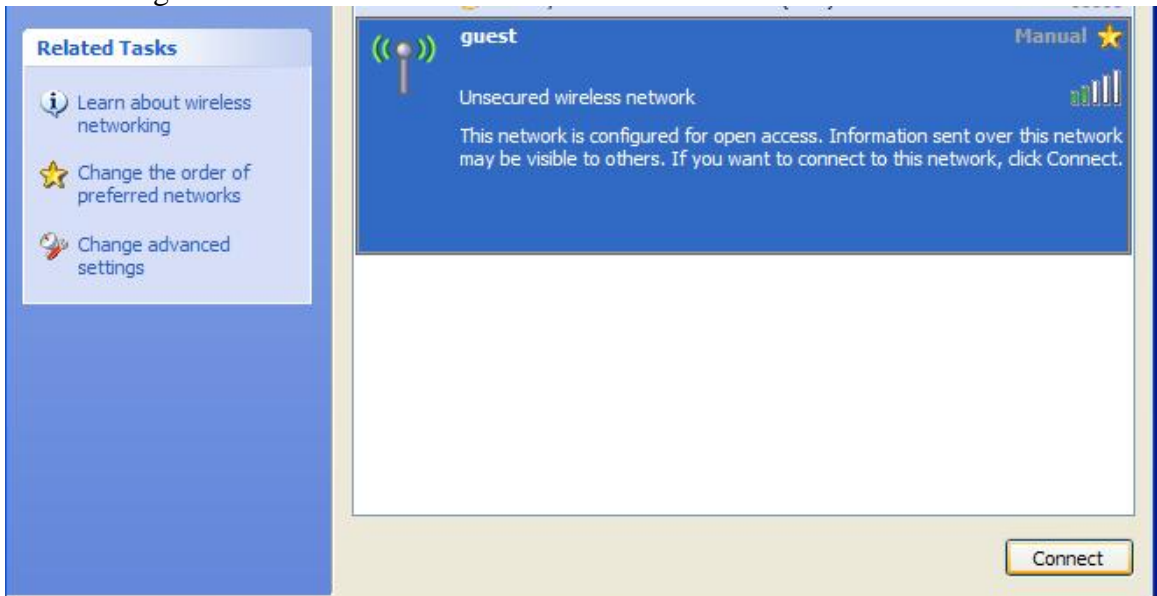
1. Right-click on the wireless adapter icon in the system tray (bottom right of the screen).



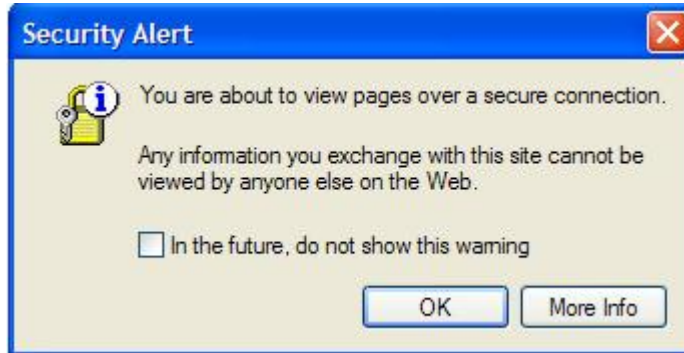
2. Select “view available wireless networks”



3. Select the “guest” network and click on the connect button.



4. Once connected, open Internet Explorer. Click OK to proceed to secure connection.



5. Click YES to accept the certificate



6. ****IMPORTANT**** If you have the Internet Explorer Pop-Up blocker, or another pop-up blocker, please allow pop-ups from <http://192.168.110.12> . For instructions on allowing pop-ups for this site in Internet Explorer and other popular toolbars, [refer to the end of this document](#).

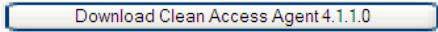
7. You should see the following webpage:

Internal Network Access:

****This section is for internal network access only. For guests of the courthouse, please refer to the section below labeled "Guest Network Access".****

If you don't have the Clean Access Agent software yet, download it by clicking the button below. After downloading the installation file, run it to complete the installation. The Clean Access Agent ensures that your computer meets the requirements for accessing this network, and helps you keep your computer secure and up-to-date.

If you have already downloaded and installed the Clean Access Agent, please close this window and right-click the Clean Access Agent icon in the system tray and choose Login from the menu. Enter your usual network user name and password in the login window.



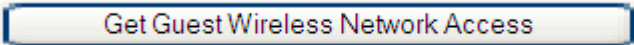
Note: If you are already running the Clean Access Agent and you are connected through a slower connection (such as VPN or dial-up), please wait as it might take a few moments for the Agent to pop up.

Guest Network Access:

If you are a guest of the courthouse, click the button below to obtain restricted internet access temporarily.



8. Locate the section labeled "Guest Network Access". Click on the "Get Guest Wireless Network Access" button.

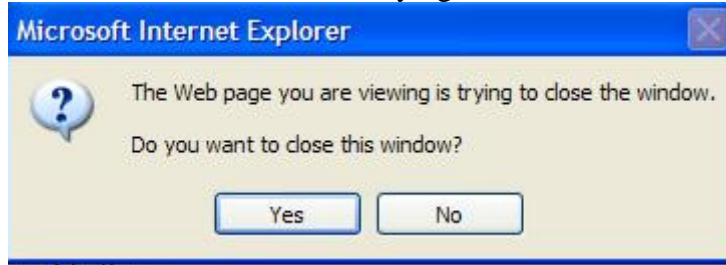


9. A new Internet Explorer window will open and access your homepage. In the background you will see a Cisco logon screen. Leave this window open until you are finished with using the internet.

10. Once finished using the network, go to the Cisco screen and click on the "Logout" button.

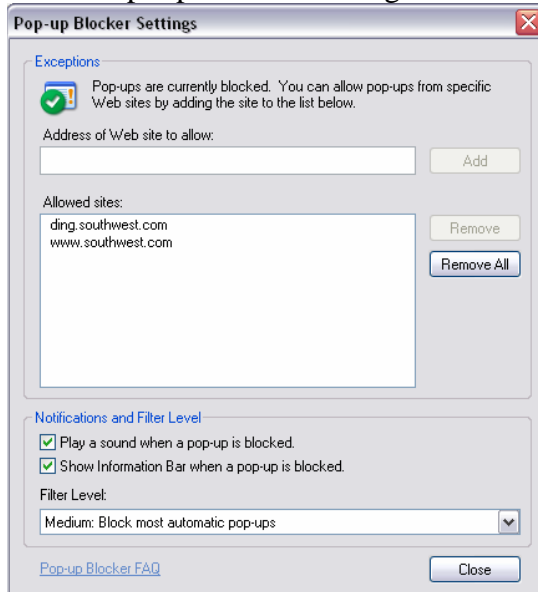


11. Click YES on the box about trying to close the window.

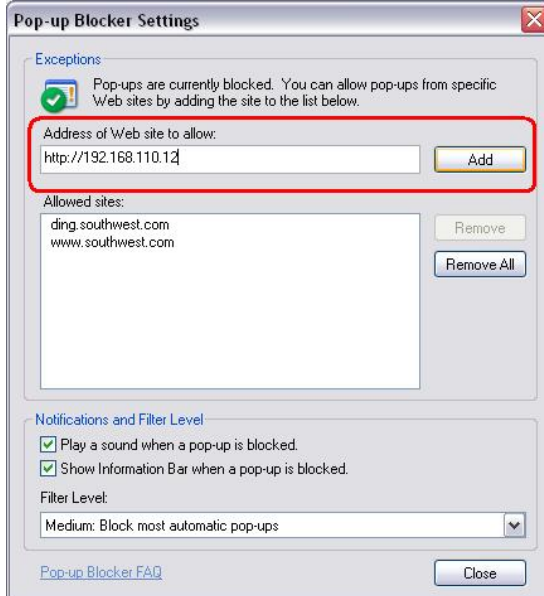


Allowing Pop-ups from a site with Internet Explorer

1. Click on the Tools menu. Roll the mouse over “Pop Up Blocker”.
2. Select Pop-Up Blocker Settings. You will see a box similar to the image below.



3. Type in <http://192.168.110.12> in the top text box, then click “Add”.



4. Click Close.

Disable Pop-up blocker on Google Toolbar

1. You will see a button on the toolbar listing the number of pop-ups blocked.



2. Click on this button and it will change to say "Pop-ups okay".



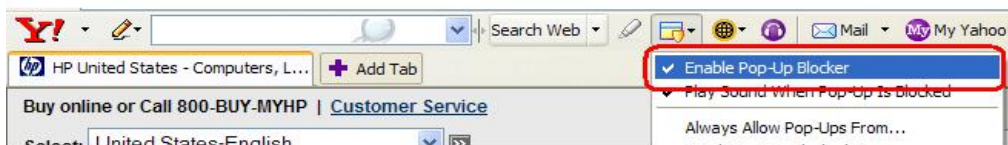
3. Click on the button again to re-enable the pop-up blocker on Google toolbar

Disable Pop-up blocker on Yahoo Toolbar

1. Locate the pop-up blocker icon on the toolbar.



2. Click the down arrow next to it. De-select "Enable Pop-Up Blocker" by clicking it once.



3. Notice the icon changes to a blue color to indicate it is turned off.



4. To re-enable, follow the same steps.
